Correspondence

1. Letter received from Province of BC, Ministry of Natural Resource Operations dated January 27, 2011. The letter is a copy of a Memorandum of Understanding for Operation and Maintenance of the Hallis Lake Recreation Trails effective January 28, 2011 File # 16660-27/Cariboo Ski Touring Club. The Province will provide the Club with contribution funding in the sum of \$1 000.00, subject to funding being available, to cover out-of pocket expenses.
2. Letter received from Quesnel Community Foundations dated January 27, 2011 signed by Sheri Coles, Grants Committee Chair. The letter states that the Quesnel Community Foundation Grants Committee is interested in considering an application for our Youth Ski Program. The application form needs to be returned to the Integris Credit Union by 5 pm on Friday, February 25, 2011.
3. Letter received from Community Futures dated February 3, 2011 signed by Darryl Atkins. Letter offers not-for-profit organizations the opportunity to attend the HR Toolkit & Workshop Series in March, at a reduced rate of 50% (\$432.50 & HST). The workshop will help your organization develop clear policies, procedures and guidelines for management and volunteers.

Committee Reports

1. Jackrabbit – Celine

Celine confirmed with Don that the invoice has been paid for SDP packages and the receipt is with Christine. February 26, 2011 is Jackrabbit Meltdown Party. There are three Jackrabbit sessions remaining. February 12, 2011 is “Bring a Friend to Jackrabbit”. This will be free for the “friend” with no ski pass needed for use of the Hallis Lake facility.

2. Nordics / biathlon – Jim/Peter

The Cariboo Nordics participated in the BC Cup 3 and 4 races in Vanderhoof on January 22, 23. Most of the younger athletes attended but some of our older racers could not be there due to exams. Kieron Langan and Kyra Teetzen both placed second in both events and Ryan Eldon and Maddison Roll both placed third in the Sprint race on Sunday. It was unseasonably warm and the trails were fast and a bit rough due to the thaw/freeze conditions, however it was unusually comfortable for the coaching staff.

The next BC Cup races are in Prince George on March 5 and 6.

The one day Northern Zone race scheduled for Hallis Lake on Feb 12 has been cancelled due to conflicts with other events, which was going to result in very low attendance from out of town athletes.

The adult introduction to biathlon session will be held on February 5 from 1:30pm to 4 pm. So far 5 people have signed up.

A meeting with the parent group to discuss the succession planning for Biathlon coaching and organization is planned for Wednesday Feb 9, concurrent with the biathlon practice. Jim is approaching the club about acquiring most of the rifles and equipment that he currently owns for the 2011-2012 season.

3. Membership – Don

Rabbit List and Biathlon list match with names on Don's list.

CSTC has 403 members which includes; 17 Jackrabbits, 7 Bunnies, 10 Biathlon participants.

CSTC sold \$120.00 worth of Xmas passes. Don recommends that we create a special Xmas pass form next year for registration.

One 2 week pass (out-of-town) was sold for \$15.00.

4. Equipment / lighted track – Brian

Pisten Bully:

The PB has been running well. The tiller has recently been used and produced good results.

Current issues:

-one track pan cylinder on the packer bar was not giving full force. It was taken to Lebrun's and was found to check out ok. It will be monitored.

-belts continue to slip on the fan / alternator drive. The tracksetters are planning some changes to improve the situation.

Twin Tracks:

Two of the Alpine 2 machines are all running well. The third (Rubber Ducky) was taken to South Shore for repairs. They are currently looking for parts. Green Gables is showing signs of needing similar work.

The Alpine 1 being kept at 10 Mile and is being maintained by the Fire Hall and is being used by club members for tracksetting of 10 Mile Lake Park. The machine is running well.

Equipment:

A utility sled was purchased from VANOC has been very useful.

Our snow grooming implements, roller and packer bar are in good shape.

A new flat deck sled was built by Bruce Self is ready for use.

Track Lighting:

The trail lighting operated reliably during the month.

5. Loppet – Elaine

55 paid participants

32 volunteers

87 lunches (leftovers given to the Katimavik group, very much appreciated)

Registration Fees: \$ 1263.00

Expenses: \$ 1123.24

Profit: \$139.76

Not a great profit, considering once I receive the track setting bill, (tongue in cheek) I'm probably in the red.

Changes implemented with registration numbers was much simpler and worked well. Bibs were pre-sorted by number. Late entries got the next available number, irregardless of race category.

Had discussions with Marilyn, Alison and Vicky about some suggested changes;

- Registration fees should be higher, and an even number, to cover costs. No fee difference for recreational division. CSTC should re-evaluate Jackrabbit fee to attract more Jackrabbits.
- Revamp entry fees: add a cost increase if not paid 3 days before race day (18+ and recreation \$25.00, late payment \$40.00, 13 to 17 pay \$20.00 late \$30.00, 8 to 13 pay \$15 late \$25, 7 and under \$10.00, late \$15.00)
- CSTC should also consider using Zone 4 or Pay Pal for registration. Example: If 10 people from out of town register and don't pay, then on race day the weather is bad and they don't show, the Loppet will still have to pay for these 10 lunches.
- check race distances on result sheets
- radios for timers and results crew
- alter registration form so that categories and entry fees are listed in the same order (youngest to oldest)
- add to job list a volunteer to record bib order of finishers

Action Item: Jim will investigate the costs and benefits of using Zone 4 for club registration and events and discuss with Herb Chlebek.

Discussions have occurred regarding emergency response procedures. Safety concerns will be discussed further by email with recommendations recorded for next year's organizing committee.

Jim recommends that the Loppet committee have one individual who is responsible for emergency procedures and safety/emergency volunteers.

Action Item: Jim and Bruce will go out and check VHF reception at Hallis.

Suggestions from Ron regarding sponsorship: \$50 to \$ 100 to be on Posters and Registration Form.

Some of the expenses, I put under lodge expense: toilet paper holders, paper products and containers for these items.

These suggestions have been made and will be brought up at the Loppet 2012 organizing committee meeting. Any recommendations are welcome for next year.

Again, thank-you to the many volunteers, track setters, participants, and of course the weather, which made this years' Loppet a success.

6. Backcountry – Bruce

The 3100 road (to the Moncton area) is REPORTEDLY snow plowed for 4 km only. It may not be plowed this far.

Also the 1300 rd. (Swift River FSR) is plowed in approximately 5 km. only.

A Thank-you letter has been sent to Craig Evanoff and Bonnie Hooge for their instruction of the avalanche course held on January 8 and 9th, 2011 and their donation of \$250.00 to the Club.

7. Social – Bonnie & Holly

Anyway, the next social is set for Feb.19, 2011 with Dougal entertaining.

I propose the year end social date be changed so it won't conflict with the TeleFest.

The next weekend would make it Spring break and then we're into April.

Discussion followed with the recommendation that the year-end social be held on April 2, 2011.

March 5th is also available if the social committee would like to organize an additional event.

Paul has set tracks in Ten Mile Lake Park and on the lake. Many thank-you's from locals.

Logging is occurring on Bjornson Loop, so trails are closed here.

Thursday, February 10, 2011 Peter is meeting with Tony Fiala and Chris Armstrong to discuss CSTC trailing setting permit for Ten Mile Lake Park.

Concerns will be shared with brushing, windfall removal and posts on the trail.

12. Elementary Ski Program- Sunshine, Celine, Lisa, Brian, Marilyn

We have been working on requests for financial assistance over the last few months and have submitted to the following groups:

7. Quesnel Winter Carnival, Feb. 5, 2011

2. Club acquisition of biathlon rifles 2011-12

Jim Crellin presented an overview of the biathlon rifles and equipment that he and Alison have purchased since 1998. This equipment has been used by CSTC biathlon team members over the years. Athletes have rented the rifles and equipment for \$150.00 a season. Approximately \$100.00 of the rental fee goes toward the purchase cost.

The purchase of the rifles and equipment by the Cariboo Ski Touring Club is important to ensure the continuation of the Biathlon program and the development of a succession plan for new Biathlon coaches. Crellins request \$2,800.00 for the seven rifles and remaining biathlon equipment.

The rifles and equipment will belong to the CSTC but an individual must personally register the rifles.

Motion: Peter moves that the Cariboo Ski Touring Club purchase by the end of the 2011 ski season, the rifles and equipment presently owned by the Crellins at the cost of \$2800.00. Greg seconded. Motion passed.

3. Club Fee Restructuring
