#### **New Business:**

- Anonymous \$18,000 to kickstart Annual Club Fundraiser!
  - (Ron) I think it might be a good idea to go with this club fund raiser and put the proceeds towards new signage. Most of the signs were new when we built the system 26 years ago and are looking a bit tired.

<u>Tania</u> will connect with Eric's friend to do an inventory of what signage is needed.

We should not ask members for donations (the kickstart funding was to match donations). Community foundation submissions are due soon, but we should first create a strategic plan for what we need over the next few years, which should include both capital investments and non-financial things like demographics, succession, etc.

Brian will take the lead on this, starting with the previous plan from Tania.

Loppet schedule

March 8-9. Solo loppet like we have done since covid. No mass start, no pressure, less volunteer effort required since you sign yourself in. Classic Saturday, skate Sunday. Invite Williams Lake and Prince George club members (free day pass, but \$5 registration fee). - 1. Lessons & Publicity: Ron Watteyne
- Adult Lessons
  - Started on Jan 6 with 11 people registered so far.
  - Savannah will be teaching again this season
  - Have sent messages out to Correlieu Outdoor Rec Program, North Star Church youth program and College of New Caledonia to promote a group ski

#### Snow Depth Gauge

- The snow depth gauge is finished and will be installed very soon. I was very optimistic and have graduations to 100 cm. It will be attached to the light pole adjacent to the timing hut and will be visible on the North Stadium web cam.
- With the snowfall this season so far, it might have been more appropriate to have the graduations in mm.

New signs are up. Some trees were removed. Danger tree assessment has been done twice in last 10 years. <u>Eric</u> will follow up with Desi on danger tree assessment. Brian met certified faller to remove danger trees identified by Sunshine

#### 3. SDP: Jordan Yntema

Update and notes:

- 1) Currently have 41 registrants for the SDP program
  - a. Breakdown is almost 50/50 for Monday and Saturday skiers.
  - b. Laurie Eco bunnies (7 Skiers) and parents skiing with their children without a season pass have been a big success.
    - i. Parents want to take adult lessons and enjoy the sport, sometimes bringing both parents to ski with their kids.

#### 2) COACHES

- a. We have a coaches meeting planned for this Saturday after the lesson to discuss juggling around a few of the groups (Bottom heavy) Maybe Peter is available to sit in on the meeting.
- I would like to discuss getting jr. coaches (teenagers) to help out with peer coaching with the kids
- 3) **Notable days and times** (1 hr Bunnies/ Jack Rabbits; 1.5 hrs Track attack/ Yetis) > -12C Bunnies; > -20C Yetis and Track Attack;

  - b. Feb 15 and 17 would like to do a Themed Ski

    - ii. Get the Lodge Dressed up for Valentine's Day.
  - c. Feb 22nd is the Dog sled races in Wells
    - i. Need to Canvas Coaches if this is something we want to do with the older skiers
    - ii. A lot of work but was fun (Rentals may need to leave Hallis for the day)
    - iii. Any volunteers willing to help out as we will need to split coaches up
      - 1. Little skiers will probably stay at Hallis.

- a. Parents passes: do we grab the clip-on passes for parents who don't have season passes?
- b. What are Paiges or the club's hours for Saturdays and Mondays?
  - i. Eco Bunnies, SDP program for rentals and start up.
- c. Could I get a mid Season Budget (after my recent expense report) for SDP and Race team?
- d. Toques have come in, but the count is incorrect, so we need to confirm that Zone 4 and XC BC are correct, as we have no bunnie toques (17 Bunnies).

Jordan will approach Rocky Peak for gifts for Yetis who don't get a free toque

Our ski pulk is broken. It has been used by parents of little skiers who have younger siblings, and also by disabled students who can then accompany classmates for the school program.

<u>Brian</u> will look at it to see if it can be fixed .Not sure where harness is located? <u>Greg</u> will send out a note to members to see if anyone has an old one to donate or sell.

## 4. Website: Shannon Coffey

I'm making progress on the website and plan (hope) to have it changed over in about 2 weeks.

I'd appreciate feedback on the homepage at the current state it is in. You can see it at <a href="https://dev.caribooski.ca/">https://dev.caribooski.ca/</a>. You will likely get some warnings that the site isn't safe, choose to view anyway (it is but it won't have a certificate till it's officially changed over).

Many of the links are active on the homepage but some are not yet and the only other page that is viewable at this time is the rates & registration page under the rates and rentals heading in the menu. More will come out soon. The great thing about this new theme is it is very flexible and easy to use, I can now easily change page layouts, headers, footers, colours, fonts, etc... which I couldn't do before so please do make suggestions.

\*\*\* I need feedback on how important the FB feed is to the home page. The plug in that allows is up for renewal Feb.2, it costs \$98 US/ year.

\*\*\* I haven't built it into the new homepage at this time but have supplied links to the FB page instead. This was purchased in the past for far less (and free at the beginning) for people who did not have FB accounts. However, prices have gone up a lot, our dollar down, and I think anyone can click on the FB link now and see the most recent posts. I also think most people go to FB to see the club posts rather than the website. If no one feels it is important I'd suggest not renewing this year but can put it on if the club thinks it is good value.

There isn't an events calendar on the page at this time, I will get one on it. We don't actually have any upcoming events on our calendar at this time and Rob's posters are always on the homepage so haven't prioritized it. I don't know how the youth ski school google calendar is shared at this time, it has never been on the website but perhaps it should go on the parent info page?

Thanks to those that have emailed me updates for the website, if you don't see the changes yet you will on the new site. I am being selective on how much time I put into the old but current site:) It was brought to our attention that minutes from board meetings are not on the website. Karen sent this year's minutes and the updated directors list, I have placed them on the website now and they will be on the new website. I don't have any of the meeting minutes from 2023... I did send a couple of emails last year asking for them and received no response so they aren't posted. I can post new minutes now as they come out and if you have the 2023 minutes I can post them if they should be up there. Race Team Committee Report (Sunshine Borsato)

- 1.Ski camp we held the first ever on snow ski camp at Hallis Jan 2-3<sup>rd</sup>. 12 athletes and three coaches (sunshine, savannah and erin) participated and it was very successful and loads of fun. We will definitely reproduce this next year earlier in the season adding another night and day. The camp cost was \$212.77 and the camp received \$180 in registrations and cost the club \$32.77.
- 2.Training (continuing as it has for a number of years) 16 participants training four days/nights per week savannah and sunshine are coaching every session and erin and chris are also coaching Tuesdays and Thursdays. We have been training on snow since December 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 3.Additional uniforms (larger sizes) were ordered in December and will be delivered in the next couple weeks.
- 4.Race schedule the earlier season races were all farther than anyone wanted to travel upcoming races our athletes are attending are the TeckCup in Smithers Feb 8 and 9<sup>th</sup>, PG BC Cup Feb 15-16, Teck Cup in 100 Mile Feb 22 and the March 8<sup>th</sup> Teck Cup in Vanderhoof. There are a couple more BCCup and Teck Cups that may be attended but not likely.


At this moment we have 280 registrants, 153 female and 127 male.

## 13. Athlete Representative: Savannah Robinson

No Frills takes bags of bottles and they do not have to be sorted or counted. We can set up an account with them, and people can also take their bottles straight there, with the money going to our account. <u>Savannah</u> will look into setting that up.

Another funding source is local businesses who might want to sponsor the team and have their logo on the jersey. *Any canvassing must be well planned and coordinated.* 

The ski camp went well. Cost to club was \$32.

24 hour ski – <u>Savannah</u> will finalize the date for this race team fundraiser. Skiers can join in at any time, and the lodge will stay open. Money will come from pledges. It will be a great event for young people. <u>Greg will promote it</u> once the date is set.
