New Business:

1. Gaming summary report. Tania.

Committee Reports:

1. Lodge Management / Gaming / Youth Ski School / Rental Shop – Tania Gruene

Ron has re-keyed all of the doors. The door locks are now down to two main key. A huge improvement.

Key 1- Lodge entrances, electrical room, timing hut and biathlon hut

Key 2- Office and ski equipment room

Youth Ski School

We have filled up and are at maximum capacity for this years with 1570 student days booked and Nazko still to pick their dates which will bring it to about 1630 student days. I have cut off registration.

We have great coach retention but have two people that are not coaching this year. That said we have 7 new coaches who have taken the course in November and look like they will be a great fit in the ski school team.

Rental Shop / Lodge

It looks like our planned opening date of December 16th will be delayed due to lack of snow. I hope we can open for Dec 20th and have a strong Christmas break. Something to think about is opening for New Year's Day and having a catered brunch and making a big ski day of it as there has been some traffic on the trails in other years. This depends on ski conditions.

We need one fill-in person at the rental shop in Jan/Feb. Typically 8-10 hours per week. I will advertise this week but if anybody know of anybody pass the info to me.

Gaming account summary

Gaming report must be approved by the board and signed off by two directors.

Christmas market

We made a total of 642 dollars at the market. Two memberships, eight 5for4cards, 4 history books, a cup and a gift certificate. The last one that I was at was slow but Janet reports that many people asked questions, got directions, picked up info sheets. Janet's input is that it was a worthwhile PR exercise.

We paid \$150 for tables, \$280 for staffing = \$430 so we did end in the black.

OPEN HOUSE

This is the next big event on the calendar. We will need to plan in the week after Christmas. Schedule attached. We will need to recruit a pancake breakfast coordinator. I will send a volunteer callout through email this week.

2. Skill Development Program: Jackrabbit/Track Attack– Sunshine Borsato

Coach meeting held Nov 20 generating a lot of energetic enthusiasm and ideas already implemented including a new speaker at the lodge and request for a couple sets of ski pups for beginners at the rental shop and showing Olympic ski races on TV in lodge including a social built around an Olympic ski race.

Also requested an AED.

Postponed start date of Dec 9 to Dec 16. Santa party scheduled December 18.

New CCBC SDP coordinator is brilliant and helpful and Santa has his toques already for the kids.

About 30 registered kids which is a season normal for this time of year increasing typically over December.

New- jackalope program and Saturday lessons time change from 10-11:30.

I have visited the Waverly and Murray cabins this season. The snow levels are low, so there are not many runs to be had. Cabins appear to be in decent shape. There was a significant pile of wood on the Waverly deck. Am I right to be worried about this added weight to the deck? Or am I just being picky?

I will be bolting an avalanche warning sign near the Cariboo cabin on my next trip. Unfortunately this may not be until early January now. If anyone is going sooner, feel free to take the sign up there.

The idea of an "Intro to backcountry skiing" day was suggested, as our local snow levels are disappointing. I love this idea, however my schedule is quite full. I would be available December 30th, January 6th, January 7th at the earliest. By then, we may have the snow we are missing. I'll leave this up for discussion, but I am willing.

Also, a member recently tried to access the Mt Murray cabin and was unable to locate the cabin. They later reached out to board members for navigation coordinates. I propose that I create a "cheat sheet" of directions + coordinates to the cabins - to be distributed to club members upon request.

- **NO directions and coordinates to be distributed for cabins. The intent is to keep the information limited to the people who book the cabins, rather than widely available on the website.**

Event Equipment Project:

This project is complete. Final reports have been submitted to Community Foundation and Community Futures. Cheques for \$5000 and \$2500 have been received. The CSTC funded \$636, much less than the planned \$1500.

Snowmaking Project:

The budget for this project is \$78,050. The NDI applications resulted in a positive response for both applications giving us \$54,635. The application for a Gaming Capital Grant for \$20,415 is pending. An answer is expected in December.

An application is being submitted this week to the BC Rural Dividend Fund. Our application is limited to \$10,000.00.

Resolution: the Cariboo Ski-Touring Club resolves to make application to the BC Rural Dividend Fund requesting \$10,000.00 to aid in financing of the snow making project to be completed in 2018.
