It has been a busy couple of weeks working through staffing changes. As you are all aware James Meyer (Club Manager) resigned last week due to personal reasons. Thankfully **Lori Carifelle**, currently our treasurer stepped up to take the Ski Club Manger position in the interim to get us through this ski season. Lori will not be able to carry out this position full time due to other commitments. As a result, we needed some additional help in the form of both administrative duties/lodge and rental assistance along with Nordic ski coaching. We interviewed several strong candidates and decided to hire **Paige Smith** who will start on Dec 9th on an as needed basis. Lori and I will track the hours of both the ski club manager and the Nordic coach to ensure we stay within our budget.

New Business:

Ski passes: 350 passes have been ordered. People can pick them up at the lodge, Ron will set up at Rocky Peak Dec 20 evening and Dec 21 morning. John is also willing to give them out. We will discuss having someone check passes on the trails in the new year.

Tasks to get ready for season:

- Tania will ask Randy to sand the road and scoop some sand into our sand box for shoveling around lodge.
- Peter will ask Brian Kenelly whether he has a bunch of dog poop bags. Bag dispenser should go on gate by parking lot. Garbage cans need to go at that gate and the entrance to Canis Lupus.
- Outhouses need to be swept, and wiped. Lysol wipes and hand sanitizer checked. Also check how bad woodpecker holes are – could use wood filler.
- Skis are in progress of being scraped.
- AV/Sound System Lori will get Paige to play with the AV system to make sure she can work it.
- Ron will get more 4/5 ski passes printed.
- Paige will manage the Facebook page.

Lori and Paige plan to take pictures of people around the trails and have the pictures displaying continuously on the TV in the lodge. Also do some periodic give-aways of swag.

- Biathlon range Shooting Platform and Biathlon Loop held up ok through all the rain and warm temps, good practice Sunday Dec 8
- 1st BC Cup Dec 13-15 Sovereign Lake. Six or seven athletes competing

- Allie Dickson in Burns Lake hosted a regional camp Nov 30-Dec1. 6 Athletes attended, enjoyed by all.
- About 10 athletes training so far.
- No further Information on eco-aim (camera based) rifles being obtained from Biathlon BC. There is a
 future plan to have only eco aim competitions at BC cups for younger classes. Cost of the Ecoaim
 rifles is \$4000-4500 +/-, same as an Anschutz Fortner. They can be set up anywhere and just use
 light, so could be a draw for the club at booths or fun days. We may be able to borrow them from PG.
 We could get a grant to purchase.
