I was able to secure a couple of fallers to take down some danger trees and they have agreed to do some training with their fire crews in March to assess and fall some other potential trees for free. In discussions with Desi he has volunteered to put some of his staff doing random checks in the parking lot looking for passes. A government truck will certainly ramp up the importance of getting a pass. Three new signs have been secured to ensure it is very clear of the expectations and make it easy to use QR code to purchase.

Manager & Coordinator's Report:

Managers report: Feb 9,2025

Programs:

- Busy with ski school, SDP and lessons. Cancellations due to cold weather will make last part of February even busier.
- February 15th invite general membership to enjoy the ski maze with SDP. Hours? *(11:00-11:30 for SDP, and general members afterwards)*.
- Upcoming events: ski night Feb 17th Family Day, will advertise to membership and allow them to order pizza as well with SDP. Hours? (will need help from lodge attendant to cover extended hours)
- March 1 costume ski day, invite general membership to join in.
- Wednesday night guided skis are still continuing.
- Snow stride Challenge, now on the Feb 4-17 leg, upcoming Feb 18-March 3, then all legs will be completed and a grand price draw for something bigger for those who completed 75 km?
- Loppet: posters to Vanderhoof, Prince George, 100 Mile and Williams Lake. March 8,9. Day one classic, day 2 skate 10,20 and 30km loops. Should we be doing prizes? Possible names: Ski for the dough, The frosted finish, The sugar glide. \$10 entry, pre entries will get a cookie from Quesnel Bakery. Late entries will get a full size chocolate bar. (Day pass will be included in entry fee: \$10 for members and \$15 for non-members, mostly to cover cost of \$7 cookies).
- Would like to have a sip n savour with live music in the lodge. March 1 or 15, but I won't be here if on the 15th. My last day is March 12. Away on holidays March 14-23, then start my own business for the season. (March 1 is date)
- Lodge still looking for part time ski coach. I am contacting CCBC and Nordiq Canada for info on where
 to find higher level coaches. Would be willing to rent out a room in my house for the rest of the season
 or for next season January to Mid March for a higher level coach? Transportation may be an issue
 though. Possibility of providing an on site bunkie for a ski coach in the future?
 - International students taking a gap year are a potential source. Transportation is an issue: to and from work every day vs. social isolation living in a potential bunkie at the lodge. Kal Tire is potential source of a grant for a bunkie. Peter will help Brian Black with grants.
- Have done a lodge orientation for part time attendants: Lily Davison, Savannah Robinson, Friday Stobbe, Irene Hyde; however they don't seem to be available for a ton of shifts. Working alone policy in place for young and new workers working alone involves check in with a contact every 2 hours during shift.
- Lunch ladies never showed up. Wondering about a hot dog roast at new snowshoe shelter on a Saturday or Sunday? Also still offering Bliss Saturday and Sundays.
- BC Parks Thomas Cameron will be doing day and season pass checks at entrance to dog loop. Will
 also be printing flyers for vehicle windows with message. 500 flyers for \$179 black and white
- Derek Woolends will be hanging the new QR code signs for day passes.
- Need stair treads installed down to rental shop (Eric will install)
- 2 burners on stove are burnt out

New Business:

- Water system orders update- Jim C
 - We will be forced to install a chlorination system, as UV will no longer be accepted since it does not deal with all viruses. Our shallow well and the lake water are not significantly different: both are surface water and would require the same treatment. Equipment will be \$10,000. Budget \$15,000 with us doing the installation. We need Northern Health's approval, so fall of 2025 is expected. The deadline is the end of 2025, but a delay in approvals will be approved since it is their delay. It is possible to get a grant to pay for this. Our \$27K can be used for this. Having some cash to contribute can help to get a grant. Jordan found information on 5 different places to get grants. Jim and Brian Black will look into grants.
- Working alone and new and young worker policy update-Derek, Sunshine and Savannah
 - The policy is posted in the office and workers were told to read it. The digital version should be on our website and on google drive. Shannon will put on website.
- Budget to actual comparison by line item- Lori
 - This has been a poor year for income, and a bad year for capital expenses.
 - Biathlon anomaly: Neil and Sunshine still owe for biathlon rifle rental
 - High utilities number was a typo
 - High membership number was a reimbursement for an overpayment
- Update on recruitment of Ski school director- Lori
 - ongoing
- Draft Strategic plan- Brian
 - Brian reviewed and updated the previous strategic plan from a few years ago. We need to add:
 - Long term vision for equipment
 - Lodge improvements insulation, etc.
 - Ski coach
 - Lodge help
 - Strategy for hiring people to help with all projects in the club
 - All directors need to look at the strategic plan and send Brian any ideas for needs or wants.
- Social media proposal -Savannah
 - Savannah did a presentation on different options she could provide for us. Savannah will send to all directors for review.
 - All directors please review prior to next meeting.
 - Tania would like to see a report periodically on how many people, who, and when we are reaching so we can tailor it to whom we want to reach.
 - Savannah's fee would be per month, only in those months we specify (probably October membership drive to March), and would only be the social media part
 - Any day to day messaging should still be done by the club manager.
 - Discussion will be tabled until the next meeting to give directors opportunity to review.
 - New logging Ron
 - o Ron got a map from Brent Carter at BCTS showing proposed logging near the North Marathon Loop, with selective logging, patches and clearcuts. The logging is proposed for summer/fall of 2026-27. We have this summer to go out there and look at it. BCTS should have talked to us before now, and Desi just found out about it. There is a new system for sharing information with the public (a forest operation map) and this information is not on there yet. This area is no longer managed by BCTS, since it is part of the Three Rivers Community Forest. Chris E and Eric should be point on this due to their expertise.
 - The bike club is planning a new route from Wonderland to Hallis. It will be a machine built, 2-way bike path. They are looking for funding now. It will only cross our snowshoe trails, not ski trails. Fat bikes in winter would be an issue. We need to keep them off ski trails, and would need good signage for that. We need to make sure the bike club does that. Bikers in summer could help with trail clearing as volunteers. Some biker ladies approached Savannah about that.
 - Use capital fund to pay for equipment repairs Tania

- Our \$27K grant can be for snowmobile repairs, water system upgrades. When the GIC is needed, we will switch to Integris. The \$5K and \$1K restricted funds should also move to Integris. This will simplify banking with new people taking over directorships in future.
 - Tania/Jim: motion to take money from the capital fund GIC at CIBC to cover equipment repairs to the Pisten Bully and Bearcat, which are costs already incurred. Motion passed.
- Sign replacement
 - o 70 signs and 30 posts are needed.
 - We need an oversight committee or 3 or 4 people. Derek, Ron, Eric, Brian Black and Savannah volunteered.
 - o Format of signs is in question
 - An application to the Community Foundation can fund most of the project, and Desi has some funding too.

Old Business:

- checking passes on trails.
 - Derek will put up new signs at parking lot
 - Lori will revise her draft flyers to make them less wordy and email to directors for approval prior to having them printed. (\$179 for 500 flyers to put on car windows).
 - Any attempts by Lori to confront skiers without passes have been unsuccessful and uncomfortable. Desi will start sending staff next week, but it will only be week days.
 - Lori will give a list of members to Desi in case paid members have forgotten their pass.
 They will be sent to the lodge to get a free day pass if they forget.

• Safe sport training update 2 outstanding directors

- o Brian will email Shannon and Derek to make sure they do the training. It is required by CCBC.
- Loppet details mass start and also solo later.
- Bearcat update Jim
 - o It has been fixed. \$5600 plus shipping from Arizona.
- 24 hour ski the new jerseys are being designed and ordered this week. Savannah would like any extra funds to go to new coaching vests, so it would be along the same lines as what people donated for.



Race team report:

18 skiers have been training hard 4 days per week and Feb 8th 7 racers attended the northern Teck cup race in smithers winning a total of 2 golds, one silver and two bronzes plus fourth and fifth place ribbons all for the skate race.

February 9th northern Teck cup#2 in smithers saw two golds, one silver, two bronzes with 5 racers skiing a very tough classic race.

The BCCup #2 is next weekend, with 7 racers attending, then the Teck cup #3 in 100 Mile the following weekend, which coincides with 2 biathlon races. Then the Teck cup #5 will be the last race in Vanderhoof March 8th.

14. Ad hoc Ski School Coordinators report

February 11, 2025

- The ski school season started with Carson elementary bringing 52 students for three sessions.
- Excellent snow and temp conditions for all three.
- Other schools booked for 3 sessions:
- Red Bluff French Grade 4/5—23 students
- Red Bluff English Grade 4/5 23 students
- St. Ann's K-3 54 students
- NCCS 1-3 33 students
- Kersley all school- 59 students
- 1 week was cancelled due to the cold. This was 1 session missed by St. Anne's and both Red Bluff. I will probably not reschedule a make-up day for St. Ann's due to lack of coaches for such a big group.

Financial: We can use our CIBC capital fund without penalty for withdrawal. I suggest we move to use the fund to cover the cost of all equipment repair (not regular maintenance) this season. This would allow us to recover the cash to our General account and hopefully begin the capital account accumulation again with a new deposit at the end of this season. This would address our requirement for Gaming (and some other grants) that the fund does not hold any savings for more than five years.
