Old business:

- Santas cabin prep. If temperatures are too low, Santa will be in the lodge instead.
- year end for Hallis submitted
- organized for Santa's cabin winter solstice Dec 21, 22 10-4. Could use volunteers at the cabin serving hot dogs and keeping fire going for an hour or two. Please come out for the solstice party starting at 5 with a snowshoe around the lake with Eric followed by drinks and appies in the lodge.
- Have hired Savannah Robinson as our ski school instructor. She and Colton Robinson will also be part time lodge attendants along with Olivia Zipser.
- Have replaced batteries and pads In AED.
- Have a few reciprocal agreements with fellow clubs, now listed on our website, where you can ski at a discount.
 - Lori will talk to Scott at Troll to push for agreement
 - Greg will publish reciprocal agreements
- Picture ID passes required by some resorts for reciprocal agreements. Pass can be done once and then put sticker on each year to update, or pay for a new one if lost. Potential to get a grant to cover equipment to do this.
 - Lori will look into making picture ID passes for next year

New Business:

- Have sent out an awesome new ski school brochure created by Savannah to all of the schools, so far have Carson School booked as well as some homeschoolers.
- So far coaches on a regular basis are Lori, Colton, and Savannah, possibly Colleen Murphy as well.
 No one else on past lists is committing to more than 1 or 2 sessions. Colton and Erin were unable to
 take the coaching course. They cannot coach until they have it. They may take the course in 100
 Mile possibly December?
- Would also like to offer snowshoeing in our school package, encouraging schools to stay the day
 and ski and snowshoe. Have asked John Courtney for a quote on snowshoes, and would like this to
 be considered for future grant applications. If half kids snowshoe and half ski, then switch, less
 coaches are needed. We are short staffed: Savannah, Lori, Colleen, Tammy. Colton and another girl
 may become available when course taken.

New Business:

1) LRF recognition - Neil

Keith Belcourt has requested some recognition of LRF Contracting for their donations to the CSTC. Is it possible to replace the outdated ABC Communication sign of the map kiosk structure with a LRF sign?

Ron will make a sign recognizing West Fraser, LRF and Griz Construction to put on kiosk.

 - Eric wondered if we should use system every year so we know it works, and people know how to use it. Ron said very little water pressure last he tried it, and it is a huge amount of work. There is safety risk using it due to high pressures. Brian questioned whether we need it at all lots of maintenance and doesn't actually do much. It is valuable for fire suppression, so we should keep the pump and sell the compressor and snow gun. Greg said we need to be careful selling, as it was bought with a grant. We can reallocate the funding to something else and let the grantors know. Table discussion to April meeting.

 Chris E will ask Dan what is happening with road plowing in area
- 5) Timing skiing Being able to self-time laps may be an incentive for some skiers. Timing fobs are too expensive. Savannah will look into making more segments for Strava so people can use the app on their phones.
- 6) College night Savannah called CNC and they were interested in having a night for students and administrators. Should also include other community members in that youngadult age group. Night skiing and apres activities in the lodge. Savannah will set this up.
- 7) Lodge attendants need to make sure wheelchair ramp is always clear of snow and ice.

The Nordic Pulse Grooming App was restarted on Dec12, however the trail names have not been upgraded yet to match those on the new trail signage. Detailed information on the changes required has been submitted to Nordic Pulse for installation. The NP system is operational and the map shows the groomed areas correctly

Report: Water System Upgrade

The upgraded water system is moving ahead slowly. The new system with Chlorination and UV treatment (required to meet BC Govt requirements for a shallow well with possible contamination) has been designed and an equipment layout developed. We are working with Kim Sepkowski to obtain approval for the design from Northern Health. Proposed Construction is late summer/fall 2026.

The new system will take up all the available floor space in the Utility room. This means all of the material currently stored in the utility room will have to be stored elsewhere. The room will have a new lock with controlled access and personal protective equipment may be required for work on the system.

- Trailer uses deep well so has good water, but volume sometimes limited. To avoid using shallow well water, a cistern can be installed so we can slowly pump into it, and large volumes will always be available. Will be done sooner than rest of work. Should look into a grant for this too, or combine with other water system work for grant.
- System will be installed next fall
- Tera will look for grant to cover cost \$15,000. Call Brian Black to ask how to get started.
- Storage for stuff that is now in utility room can be in sea-can, unless warm storage needed.
 - Shelves can be installed
 - Lori will go through the room to see what needs to be kept and stored.

Report: Existing Water System Coliform Test Failure

A notification was received from Northern Health on Dec 9 that the regular water test sample had shown higher than allowable coliform content. Review of the system on Dec 10 found that the UV unit had been unplugged. The UV system was restarted, however protocols require that the water system be considered contaminated until an acceptable sample is tested. The system was shocked with chlorine on December 11, appropriate signage was placed at the main floor sink. The system was flushed with water on Dec 12 and the UV unit was put back in service. On Dec 14 the UV unit was alarming and not in service. The problem was caused by deterioration of the system door latch assembly which opened a safety switch preventing the UV bulbs from firing. The door was re-secured (duct tape) and system was returned to service. A water sample will be taken tomorrow (Dec15) and submitted to Northern Health.

- Brian bought blue jugs to use for drinking water for now
- 13. 50th anniversary / winter solstice Jordan
 - Chris E has Eco Aim rifle available for people to try, either at cabin or inside if too cold. (they
 are basically a camera)
- 14. North end marathon deadfall and brush ongoing problem
 - If logged as per community forest plan, road will be fixed, but not in near future.
 - Groomers will decide in meeting tomorrow whether to keep open
- 15. Rescue sled
 - If anyone takes a sled, Lori needs to know in case of emergency
 - Ron is meeting with RCMP and Search and Rescue to discuss procedures
 - Skandic needs to be always ready to go
 - AED training required for anyone who might be called for a rescue
- 16. Zone 4
 - Extra fees at checkout annoy people. Can include in our regular fee so it is hidden (but cost will be higher).
- 17. Dog trail survey Greg sent out a survey in Dec 11 email about dog trails. 47 responses so far. 39 supported more trails. CCBC rules say we must avoid sharing trails with dogs and other skiers. Our forest service road does share not ideal but no way for us to have completely separate dog area. We have more dog trails than other clubs. Some clubs even charge day/season passes for dogs. General decision was to leave as is.

The castle will be affixed to two fence posts with a double heavy hinge to allow easy access for the groomers.

Dryland shooting practices have been running through November. Looks like we will be on skis for Dec 13 J.

BCWG biathlon trials scheduled for December 27th? at Caledonia. Max, Kierstyn and Roan are age eligible.

7. Race Team:

There has been a few weeks of scheduled down time as dryland wrapped up late November and skiing is starting December 10th.

Sunshine and Erin and Chris E met for a coach meeting to lay out the season plan.

The first session Dec 10th will be coached by Chris Elden. Saturday, Dec 13th will be a slow start ski lesson. Interesting note – traditionally, December 10th has been the first day of on snow training – good to have a somewhat normal feeling season start up.

Please note, as previously reported and already updated on the website, race team practices have changed this year to be longer in duration and fewer days/nights – Saturday, Monday and Wednesday. Dec 15th will be a coach, athlete and parent meeting in the lodge at 5:30pm and then a regular ski lesson until 7pm, Wednesday Dec 17th 5:30-7pm and Saturday 11am – 1:30pm as these are this year's regular ski lesson times and days. (Note Dec 15 postponed)

The first xc race is Jan 3rd – this is a northern Teck in Williams Lake and the BCWG qualifier. We have three racers who will try out for both biathlon trials Dec 27th and XC trials Jan 3rd.

I would like to encourage team lunches this year on Saturdays in the lodge. I am hoping I can organize with Lori C to have soup for racers so they can practice during SDP and Biathlon times and then train again after a lunch together for both biathlon and xc. This can come out of the race team budget but I would like to arrange a deal to provide this or else I can do this on my own for key days. I think it will be an opportunity to model fueling while bringing the team together for more training,

December 29-30th is our ski camp – we will need the lodge for those two days as we will sleep and cook in the lodge again like we did last year. This was an amazing experience for the athletes (sleeping in the lodge was less amazing for Sunshine and Erin) and this year we have 100 mile bring a few skiers and possibly Williams Lake. We will need to add a zone four registration for the camp to be sure we are covered with other skiers from other clubs coming. (*The lodge will be open 10am – 5pm so the camp will need to work around that.*)

Erin is finished her Train 2 Train level of coaching December 14th making her our highest qualified youth coach. Way to go Erin and thank you for taking these coaching courses! It is so much needed in our club and appreciated.

Season start up went well. Activity included repair/maintenance to the equipment door on the shop + start-up of all the snowmobiles & the PB. A battery was purchased & installed on the Bearcat.

Grooming, more specifically roller packing, began the week of Dec 1/25. Snow depth, snow condition (heavy & wet) + warm temperatures made for difficult working conditions for the grooming crew. To effectively tow the roller packer behind the Skandic, multiple snowmobile passes were made on each ski trail to be able to successfully roller pack. Roller packing was completed on the lit track, Gerry's, biathlon, Canis & South loop

+ the North side up to and including the 5kms. Ski trail packing and grooming will expand as snow depth increases and temperatures cool off. The activity by the grooming crew did result in a good base to build from this season.

2 new grooming & track setting members to welcome to the group. Dwayne Sales & George Paul have agreed to step up and fill 2 spots we had vacant on the crew. Thank you to George and Dwayne for volunteering in this capacity and supporting the group.
